The CAA provides coast-to-coast transportation, housing and employment for every one of the outstanding college ballplayers who make the pilgrimage to the legendary Cape Cod Baseball League. The CAA also pays for salaries, travel and housing for the coaches, supplies, uniforms and equipment for the entire team's rugged, intense 44-game schedule.

The CAA operates baseball clinics for youngsters, gives scholarships to local high school seniors, MVP trophies to local athletes, and sponsors many youth league teams. All CAA directors and members work voluntarily year-round to raise funds and run the program, which was recently voted Best Amateur College Program of the Decade by Baseball America.

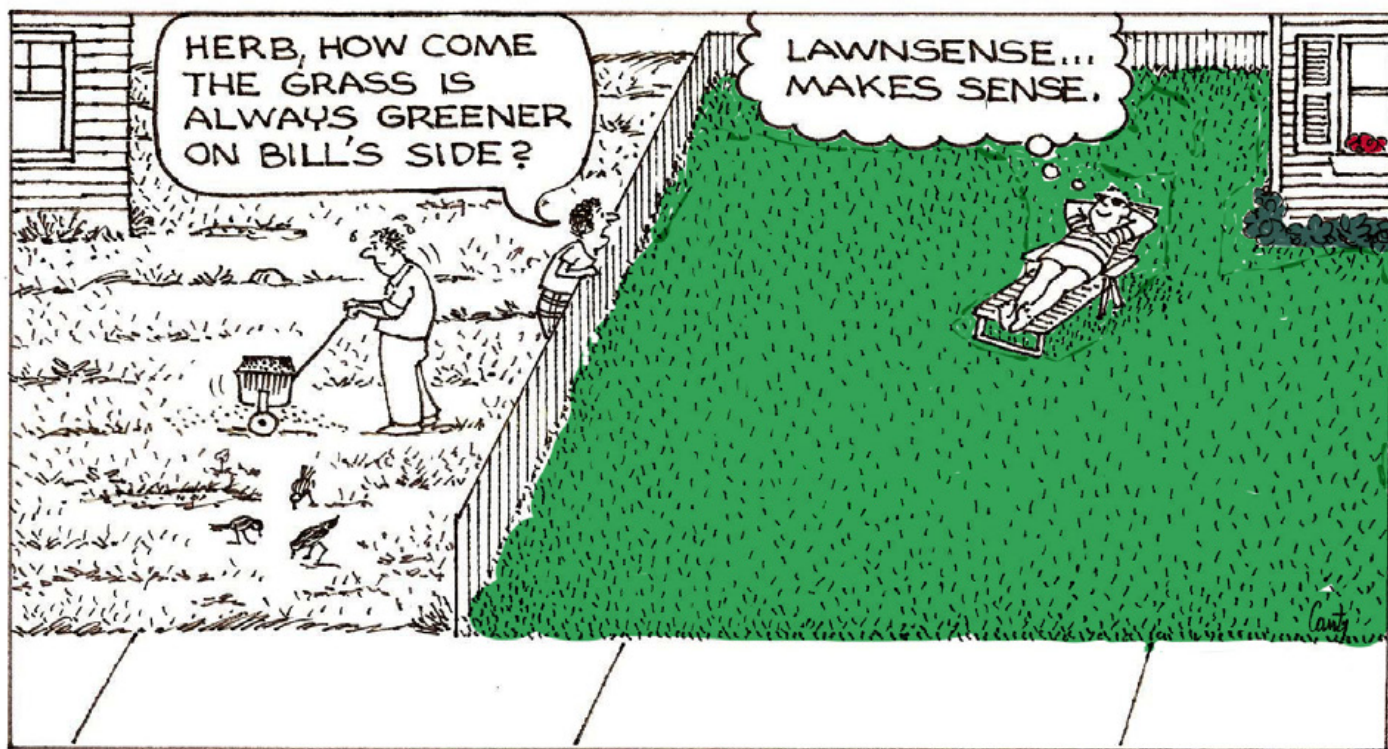

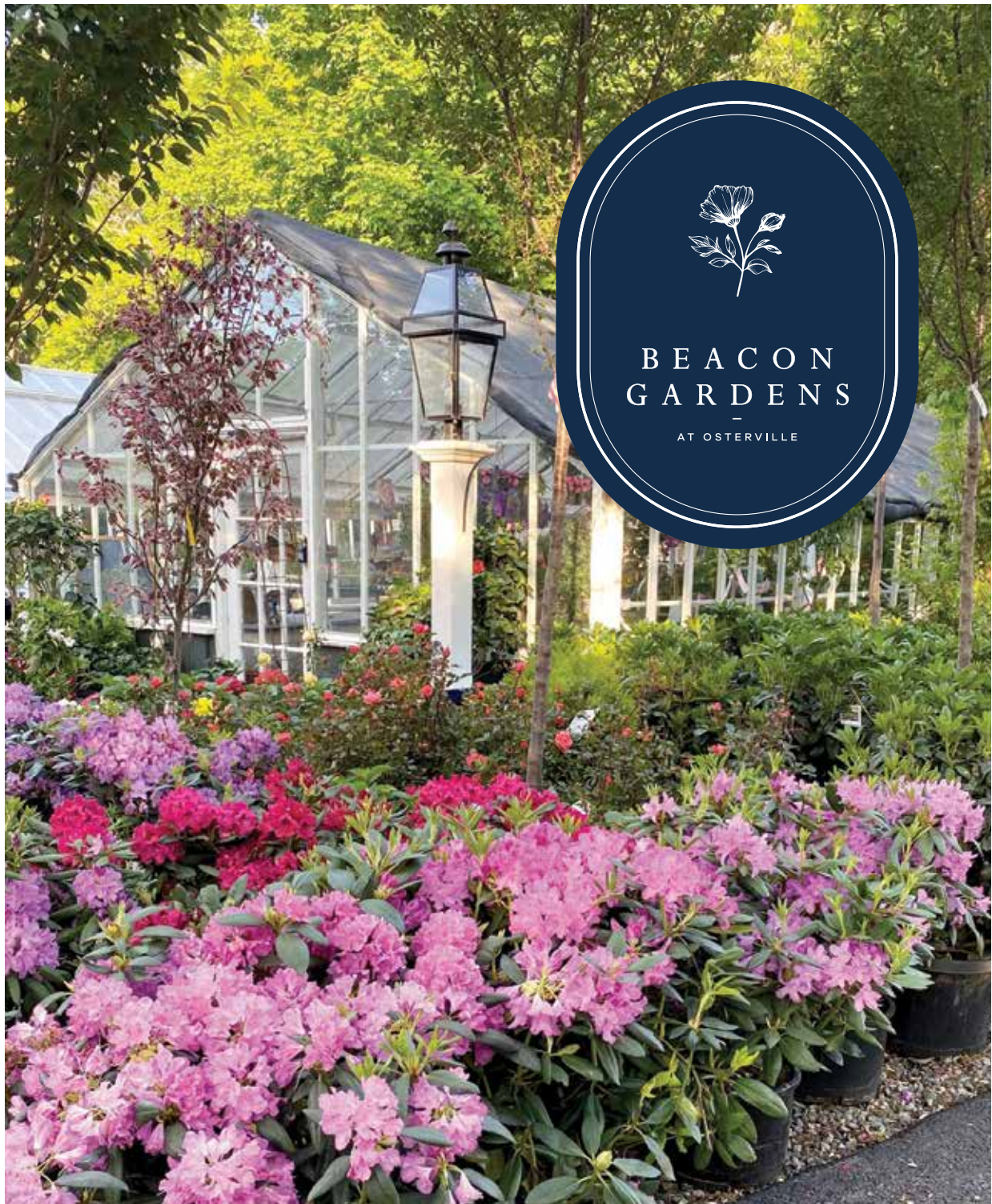

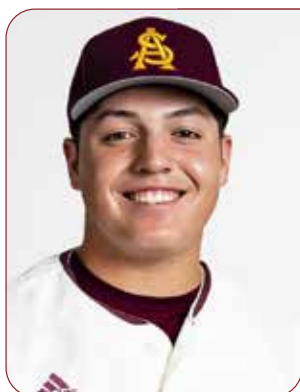

MIKE ROBERTS, FIELD MANAGER



Coach Roberts returns for his 19th season in 2023. During his coaching tenure in the Cape League, which includes 2 seasons in Wareham in 1984 and 2000 where both teams made the playoffs, Coach Roberts has led his team to the playoffs in 14 of the 18 seasons in Cotuit. The Kettleers have brought home the Arnold Mycock Championship Trophy to Cotuit in 2010 and 2013, and 2019. In 2012, the team won the President's Trophy for the best regular season record in the league at 30-14. This was the first time the Kettleers had reached 30 wins under Coach Roberts' leadership.

From 1978 through 1998, Roberts was the head coach at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. He then went on to UNC-Asheville, where he coached in the spring of 2000. All totaled, Roberts' UNC teams made nine NCAA post-season and two College World Series appearances. Five times his teams captured the ACC Regular Season Championship and four times the ACC Tournament Championship. Eight of Roberts' former North Carolina players were first round draft picks. Sixteen of his former players at UNC have played in Major League Baseball. His greatest individual coaching success is his own son, Brian Roberts, who played 14 seasons in the Major Leagues, was a two time all-star 2nd baseman for the Baltimore Orioles and New York Yankees.

Bobby Evans, former student manager at UNC for Coach Roberts, is a former General Manager of the San Francisco Giants. Walt Weiss, who played for Coach Roberts at UNC-CH and in the Cape League, went on to become American League Rookie of the Year in 1988. Walt managed the Colorado Rockies for five seasons and is now the bench coach for the 2021 World Champion Atlanta Braves.

Five of Coach Roberts' former players are now collegiate head coaches, many are assistants, and several others work in professional baseball or are professional baseball athlete's advisors. *"I am pleased many of the student athletes I recruited through the years continue to enjoy a career helping young men reach their academic, athletic, and career goals."*

"Each summer in Cotuit, the goal is to win a Cape League Championship. We strive to accomplish this goal with mature college student athletes from around the nation who embrace practicing and playing at picturesque Elizabeth Lowell Park. Many of the Kettleers players become involved in our lovely Village with the July 4th parade and festivities, Willowbend Country Club, and the ever-popular Kettleers baseball clinics. The athletes provide guidance & set examples of leadership for the young fans. An example being some players go with Coach every Tuesday morning to read to children at Cotuit Library. The athletes are encouraged to build close relationships, many which last a lifetime, with the community & their host families." explained Roberts.

Prior to managing Wareham to the Western Division regular season title in 2000, Roberts led Wareham to the same title in 1984. Each of those two seasons, Roberts' Cape League teams led the entire League in stolen bases and continue this tradition with the Kettleers. In 2000, Roberts' Wareham team tied the Cape League all-time single season stolen base record with 134 stolen bases.

In the off-season, Coach Roberts has studied for his Doctorate in Sports Administration at the University of New Mexico, does base stealing

clinics and recently spoke at the 2022 ABCA National Coaches Convention in Chicago on base stealing before 4,500 coaches and 2000 coaches on line. He has two books on base stealing. The first titled *"You Can't Steal Second Base and Keep Your Foot on First!"* published in Dec. 2008 and the 2nd book titled *"Baserunning"* was published in Dec. 2013.

When not in Cotuit coaching the Kettleers, He is full time working in player development for the Pittsburgh Pirates. His areas of emphasis are base stealing and mentoring coaches. Coach Roberts has also worked for the Chicago Cubs and Baltimore Orioles. .

Several base stealing videos were filmed at beautiful Lowell Park in Cotuit in 2011, and a hitting video was filmed at Lowell Park in 2012. His son Brian, who led the American League in stolen bases in 2007, contributed to the first book and the DVD which shows clips of Brian stealing bases for the Orioles.

Mike is a former full-time professor for Asbury University, outside of Lexington, Kentucky, and Director of the Dept. of Sports Management. Several of his former students have interned for the Kettleers in recent summers. He is currently teaching on-line Sports Management courses for Spring Arbor University, Spring Arbor, Michigan

In January 2015, Coach Roberts was inducted into the American Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame.

He has a daughter, Angie R. Stroman, in Dallas, TX and she and her husband David have two boys; Tyler and Brock. His son Brian lives in Sarasota, FL with wife Diana and their three boys; Jax, Nash, and Cru.

Coach Roberts is engaged to Mary W. Britt. Mary is a retired teacher from Atlanta but grew up in North Carolina. She has two sons who both live in Nashville, Tn. with their families. Mary has four grandchildren.

Behind the Fence: *How the Kettleers Internship Program Impacts & Inspires*

Besides hosting players from all over the country, the Kettleers have developed a thriving internship program. This program allows college students to explore opportunities related to their field of study in Cotuit. Since 1999, the number of interns has grown from five to over 25 who play a variety of roles behind the fence and around the park.

"We want to give kids the opportunity to be creative and develop skills they might not know they need or want," said intern supervisor Leah Ridpath. "We also want to challenge people and really push women forward in the sport."

Leah is one of three people who manage the program, with Scott Hill, the game day operations coordinator, and Glenn Ware, who helps the media interns. All three agree that the program would not be where it is without longtime intern coordinator Don Lesieur.

"He was one of the original intern supervisors, putting the pieces together to help get us where we are," said Leah. "He's just a really smart, incredibly creative guy and he taught us a lot."

As for the goals of the internship program, Scott said there are a couple. "I hope it brings them success in the future in their chosen careers or at least gives them the experience to set them on a path," said Scott. "I also hope they have fun with us, have a good time, but get a lot out of it."

There are several roles that interns have in Cotuit: photographers, play-by-play announcers, writers, sideline reporters, interns in community relations, game day operations, social media, retail/marketing, general manager, and Major League Baseball liaisons are some of the internships offered. Interns from past years have learned a lot from their stints at Lowell Park.

"I really just learned what it was like to live through the grind of a season," said writer and play by play intern Joe

Pratt. When you're covering games every day, you get pretty good at writing game stories."

"I learned first and foremost that I definitely belong in sports in some capacity," said graphics and social media intern Cassie Baker. "Additionally, I learned intense time management skills because there are literally games every day, how to work hard and enjoy the ride."

Features included with the internship program include housing for those who need it. Interns are matched with host families using a survey that relieves the stress of finding a place to stay on Cape Cod during the summer. The Kettleers also offers a mentor program, allowing interns to meet

professionals in the sports industry who have transitioned from college to career. It provides interns with a connection in the field they may want to explore.

"The mentoring program was pretty helpful for me. It gave interns a chance to listen to people who have established themselves in the sports industry," said game day operations intern Elliot Wolf. "Hearing their stories and asking them questions gave me a better idea of what I was interested in and what I need to do to pursue my goals."

Many interns love working for the Kettleers so much they come back for another year, which is the case for many interns in this year's group.

"I wanted another opportunity to come back and work for a great organization and work with another great group of players, coaches, and Coach Roberts," said general manager and MLB liaison intern Will Thompson. "Also, I wanted one more opportunity to make a run at a Cape League championship."

"I decided to come back for a second year because I feel like there is still so much left for me to learn through the Ketts," said social media and community relations intern Nola Gallagher. "I'm so excited to take advantage of another summer on the Cape."

The internship program allows for college students to find their passions and get exposure to what a job in the sports industry may be. Former interns of the Kettleers are now doing play by play, photography, sideline reporting, production, front office work, and other jobs for major and minor league teams.

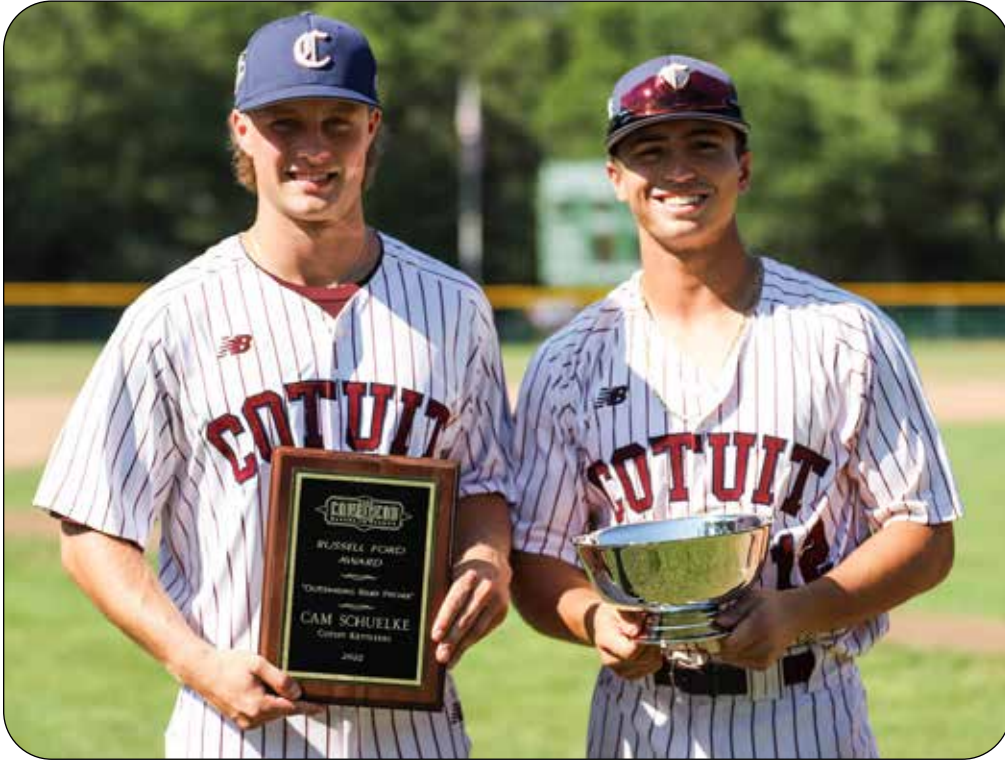

Ivan Partridge; The Voice of the Village

When attending a Cotuit Kettleers game, two phrases echo throughout Lowell Park. “Hey Cotuit” and “Have a Hit.” Have a Hit was the rallying cry of lifelong Kettleers fan Ivan “Have a Hit” Partridge. Mr. Partridge passed away in 2017, but his voice is still heard throughout Lowell Park.

Ivan was involved with the Kettleers for fifty years, thirty of which were as a volunteer. He also served as President for one year in 1999 and was on the board of directors. You could find Ivan roaming the stands raising donations and making conversation with fans.

“He was all dressed in Kettleers gear, and he was always a very positive influence at the field for years,” said Paul Logan, former President of the Cotuit Athletic Association and current board member. “For many years, he oversaw the donations at the games, going in both grandstands and around the park encouraging folks to make donations to the Kettleers,” Logan said.

During his time with Cotuit, he had a lasting impact on Lowell Ave and throughout the Cape League. He was named an honorary Director of the Cape Cod Baseball League, and there were even t-shirts made with “Have a hit” printed on them.

“Everybody knew Ivan, and he was very recognizable with people from each of the ten franchises. Ivan was here, there, and everywhere,” stated Logan.

As Mr. Partridge’s health began to decline, the Kettleers asked him if they could record him saying his iconic “Have a Hit” phrase since it had become a staple at Lowell Park. “Ivan was easily recognizable at Lowell Park and visiting locations around the Cape as a jovial ambassador of the Kettleers organization,” said Logan.

This season Cotuit will honor Ivan with a dedication for him and his family at Lowell Park. The dedication is set to take place on June 12th, with a rain date of June 14th. Mr. Partridge made an everlasting impact in Cotuit that is still felt today, and he set the example of what it means to be a Kettleers volunteer.

2023 MANUEL ROBELLO SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS

Established and first awarded in 1987, the scholarships are given by the Cotuit Athletic Association in memory of Manuel Robello, a member of the first Cotuit Kettleers baseball team in 1947 and long-time supporter of the Cotuit Athletic Association until his death on March 19, 1986. 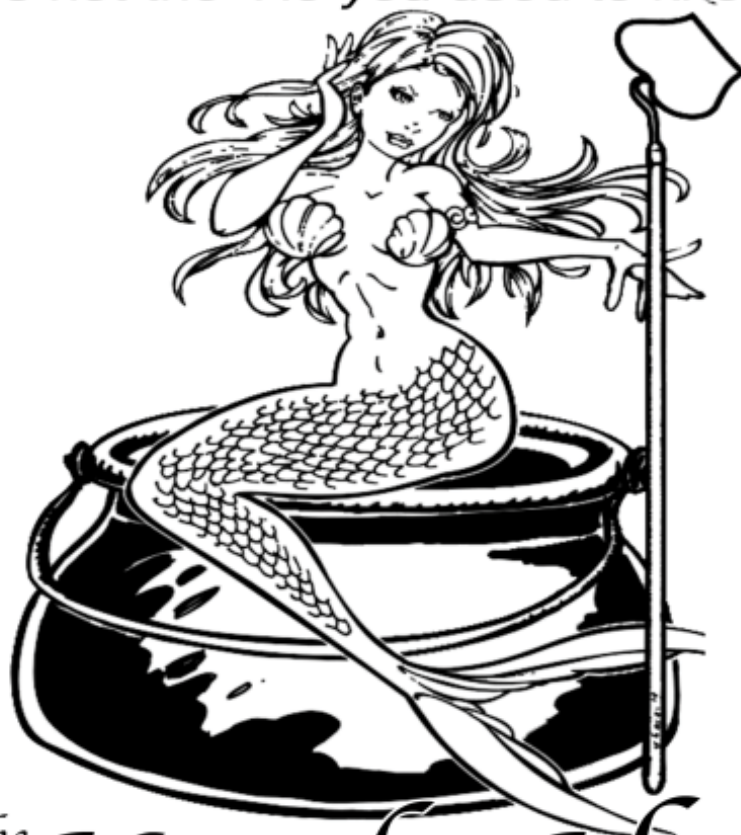

The Players Before You: A Kettleer's Journey to Cotuit

On June 10 when the Kettleers host the Chatham Anglers at Lowell Park, Cape League baseball will be back in Cotuit.

Opening Day will bring a 10-month offseason to an end and the excitement will be felt by everyone, especially the players. It's a long journey for them, as the young men who will don the signature Old English "C" on their hats will come from all over North America to play with and against the best talent college baseball has to offer.

As the players move in with their host families and start to build chemistry together in the days leading up to the start of the season, one thing they will realize is that everyone's journey to Cotuit is different.

There will be plenty of players you would imagine would be given this opportunity; highly rated players out of high school that have gone on to tear it up at big NCAA Division I schools in power conferences such as the SEC, Pac-12, and ACC.

The Kettleers and coach Mike Roberts have strong relationships with over 100 schools and their coaching staffs, where both sides will approach each other with players they want to add to the team.

However, there are players like right-handed pitcher Cam Schuelke, who is anything but a traditional prospect. He played at the junior college level in the 2023 season at the College of Central Florida and pitches from three different arm slots. In 2022, he pitched at Division II Northwood University and went on to win the Russ Ford Award as the

Cape League's most outstanding relief pitcher with the Kettleers.

Schuelke's story on Cape Cod started with another CCBL team. He originally signed with the Hyannis Harbor Hawks, but was cut before he could make any game action. Schuelke used a free round voucher at a mini golf course he won earlier in the week to blow off steam from the bad news. While he was there, Schuelke met a group that invited him to play the round with them.

"This older guy with his son and his son's friend invited me to play and I get to talking to them and had fun, whatever," said Schuelke. "Turns out the older guy was Peter Flaherty Sr. and so obviously his son's the recruiting director and helped me get to Cotuit."

As he returns to Cotuit for a second summer, Schuelke's story is a testament to general manager Bruce Murphy, Roberts, and the rest of the baseball operations team who are always working to field the best team possible at Lowell Park.

"It's 24/7/365 operation whether it's now in the home stretch of the college baseball season or we're in December," said 2022 director of baseball operations Peter Flaherty. "We're always looking at guys and seeing what we can do and focusing on not just this year, but also in the future and establishing core groups going forward."

The 2023 roster will be made up of around 26 players on permanent contracts, who will serve as the foundation of the team. These players will be counted on to be around

for the entire summer and most are not eligible for the MLB Draft that will start on July 9. Temporary contracts are also offered, which go to players that have a risk of leaving due to their draft-eligible status.

While the reliability of a player is a part of the process, there are many other factors that determine if a player is ready to be a Kettleer. It matters to the front office if a player is performing well and is posting good statistics at their schools, but it's only a fraction of what the baseball operations team looks at.

"Primarily you're also looking at, 'Who really performed in other summer leagues last summer with wood bats?' said Will Thompson, who is in his third season as an intern with the Kettleers and second season as the MLB Scout Liason/GM Intern. "Because obviously, you will see the numbers offensively from metal bats to wood bats go down significantly."

Cotuit also looks at character off the field for players too. The makeup of a player is just as important as any quality they possess between the lines.

"The best is the standard for us whether it's the player that they are or the human being that they are," said Flaherty. "We're kind of looking for leaders and guys who are going to represent the community well, so there's a lot that goes into it with signing guys."

Once the season starts, player evaluation doesn't stop and the baseball operations team will continue to look for players that can help improve the team. Although the number of permanent contracts sits at roughly 26 players, that figure is sure to go up. For example, the 2022 Kettleers saw 29 different players with at least a plate appearance and 33 different arms pitch in at least one game.

The new faces to be seen often come from other summer leagues across the country. Many of them end before the CCBL, such as the NECBL or Cal Ripken League. The

baseball operations staff will look for players that excelled in these leagues and offer them the chance to keep their summers going in Cape Cod.

The impact of late-season additions was exemplified by Ryan Galanie from last season's squad. He performed well in the NECBL but his team failed to make the playoffs, giving him the opportunity to come to Cotuit at the end of the regular season. Despite just five at-bats for Cotuit before the postseason, Galanie made it into the lineup and homered in a Game 2 blowout win against Hyannis in the CCBL quarterfinals.

No matter when the players are offered a contract, they are well aware of the reputation the Kettleers hold.

"It's a prestigious league and I would love to play in it. It's the best players, the best coaches and they all want to win," said catcher Caleb Lomavita, who's entering his second season with Cotuit. "There's a lot of scouts so of course it is a big goal of mine."

The players view the Cape League in multiple ways. It's a mix of improving as a player and proving they belong among the best, winning, and getting their name out there for the MLB Draft. After all, the slogan of the CCBL is, "Where the stars of tomorrow shine tonight!"

"The ultimate goal is to get to the top of the top, so it's a good step," said Schuelke. "I'm glad I'm viewed up there with a bunch of these guys that dominate college baseball, but at the end of the day, I'm expecting to go out there and do to them what I do to everybody else."

The journey that the players make to Cotuit is a rewarding experience. In a 44-game regular season and playoffs that all wraps up in just over two months, memories are made that last a lifetime.

Once the season ends, baseball operations will quickly turn their focus towards 2024 and new players will already be offered contracts by September and October.

Directions to the Cape Cod Baseball League Fields

BOURNE BRAVES – Doran Park - Upper Cape Tech School - Route 6 - Bourne

Route 28 to Mashpee rotary, take second right on Rte. 151 and go 6.6 miles to Route 28N, then 6.8 miles to the Bourne Rotary. Take first right out of rotary on Rt. 6 towards the Sagamore Bridge for .3 mile. Turn right uphill to Upper Cape Regional Technical School. At top of the hill bear left to the parking lot on the left side of the school. Baseball diamond is behind the school.

BREWSTER WHITECAPS – Stonybrook Elementary School Field - Underpass Road - Brewster

Route 28 to Route 149 N to Mid-Cape Highway (Route 6) east toward Hyannis. Take Exit 85 (Rte 137) - Brewster, and turn right off exit ramp. Cross the Mid-Cape Highway (Route 6) and after 3.0 miles turn right on Underpass Road. Go .2 and turn left into the Stonybrook Elementary School. Baseball diamond is behind the school.

CHATHAM ANGLERS – Veterans Field - Depot Station - Chatham Center

Route 28 to Route 149 N to Mid-Cape Highway (Route 6) east toward Hyannis. Take Exit 85 Chatham, and turn left off ramp onto Route 137 S. Follow Rt. 137 S thru lights (Rt. 39) 1.7 miles to a four way stop. Turn left onto Old Queen Ann Rd. and after 1 mile, bear right at "Business District" sign. After stop sign, continue on Old Queen Ann Rd. for 1.2 miles to Rt. 28. Turn left and after .3 mile, (Cumberland Farms convenience store - Gulf Station) on the right, proceed through lights .2 mile and turn left on Veterans Field Rd. Veterans Field is at end of the street.

FALMOUTH COMMODORES – Guv Fuller Field - Main St. - Falmouth Center

Route 28 to Mashpee Rotary. Go around rotary to the third right keeping the Mashpee Commons Mall on your right and follow Route 28 sign to Falmouth for 8.6 miles. Turn right at the Falmouth Police Station which is just past the Falmouth Plaza on your left (look for sign saying "Guv Fuller Field, Home of the Falmouth Commodores"). Be careful about where you park. **DO NOT PARK IN POLICE AREAS BEHIND THE FIELD WHICH ARE CLEARLY MARKED.** Field is behind the recreation building to the left of the police station.

HARWICH MARINERS – Whitehouse Field - Oak St. - Harwich Center

Route 28 to Route 149 N to Mid-Cape Highway (Route 6) east toward Hyannis. Take Exit 82 (Route 124) to Harwich, and turn right off ramp. At first intersection (4-way stop), turn left onto Queen Anne Rd. for .3 mile. Turn right onto Oak St. for .8 mile (marker Whitehouse Field with an arrow) and proceed past Cranberry Valley Golf Course to Harwich High School on the left. Turn left into the parking lot just before the school – Whitehouse Field is behind the trees lining the parking lot on the left.

HYANNIS HARBOR HAWKS – McKeon Park - High School Rd. - Hyannis

Route 28 to Hyannis. Go pass the Centerville Bell Tower Mall and .2 mile after the lights, bear right at sign to Hyannis on West Main Street (Rockland Trust Bank on left). Continue on West Main Street 2 miles to rotary. Go halfway around and continue on West Main Street. Bear right at fork onto South Street and follow through one set of lights. Turn right .2 mile after St. Francis Xavier Church onto High School Rd. McKeon Field is behind school.

ORLEANS FIREBIRDS – Eldridge Park - Route 28 - Orleans

Route 28 to Route 149 N to Mid-Cape Highway (Route 6) east toward Hyannis. Take Exit 89 Rt. 6A - Orleans, and turn right off exit ramp. At the traffic light, turn right onto Eldridge Parkway and continue for .6 mile. Watch for tennis courts on the left and a funeral home on the right. Turn left into parking area just before tennis courts. Field is behind the parking lot.

WAREHAM GATEMEN – Clem Spillane Field - Route 6 (Marion Road) - near Wareham Center

Route 28 to Mashpee rotary, take Route 151 which is second exit and go 6.6 miles, then take Route 28 N for 6.8 miles to the Bourne Rotary. Go over the bridge and continue on Route 25 towards I-495 for 6.7 miles and take Exit 1 for Wareham and turn right off exit ramp. Go .2 mile towards lights and bear right on Rt. 6 & 28. Go .1 mile and at the fork in the road and bear left on Route 6 toward Wareham and Marion for 2.4 miles. Just after Wareham center, turn left on Rt. 6 (Chapel St.) and .2 mile on the left is Clem Spillane Field directly behind the Town Hall parking lot. If full, continue to Veterans Dr. behind the field.

YARMOUTH-DENNIS RED SOX – Red Wilson Field - D/Y Regional High School - Station Ave. - So. Yarmouth

Route 28 to Route 149 N to Mid-Cape Highway (Route 6) east toward Hyannis. Take Exit 75 and turn right off the exit ramp onto Union Street. Proceed 1.4 miles - Dennis Yarmouth School is on the left, and there is usually a sandwich board indicating that there is a game. Take that left into parking lot. Field is behind the parking lot.

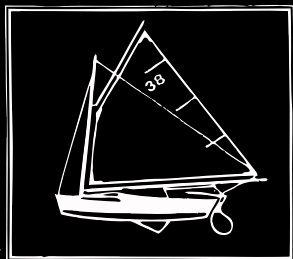
